2016 Key Highlights

The KCEDC Board of Directors continually seeks to improve the economic well-being and quality of life of the community by sustaining and growing business and workforce, as well as creating value-added programming. KCEDC is proud to provide key highlights from 2016 accomplishments:

- Partnered with the City of Kewaunee to showcase the Kewaunee harbor revitalization & celebrate the \$4.2M state grant with Gov. Walker & elected officials. Collaborated with the city and private developers to improve the 3.5 acre waterfront site adjacent to the seawall.
- Served 52 businesses (ranging from 2 to 200 employees) with project specific requests in areas including, economic development incentives, site location, financing, workforce development issues and grants.
- Partnered with the education community to launch "Business & Education Summits". The goal is to bridge the gap between business and education to create a workforce for today and tomorrow.
- Launched a "Business Walk" program focused on fostering ongoing, active relationships in the small business community. The first "Business Walk" was hosted in Algoma and included visits to 14 businesses that employed 64 employees. Approximately 60% of the businesses indicated an increase in revenues from the previous quarter or year.

Community Response Team Formed After Masonite Closure

The Kewaunee County Economic Development Corporation (KCEDC) assisted in the creation of a Community Response Team in an effort to proactively respond to the closure of Algoma Hardwoods (Masonite Corp).

Community Response Team is led by KCEDC, the City of Algoma and Kewaunee Countv UW-Extension and includes representatives from the Bay Area Workforce Development Board, Algoma Main Street Program, Algoma Area Chamber of Commerce, as well as other local community organizations and distinguished elected leadership. In November of 2016, the team began a critical dialogue focused on short-term and long-term community and economic planning strategies.

The Community Response Team established a process and

timeline for coordinating and collaborating with the Department of Workforce Development to ensure displaced employees receive assistance with training, education and the next phase in their employment. In addition, the team began planning efforts to assess the long-term community impacts of the closure and potential opportunities for economic development.

The goal of the Community Response Team is to explore any and all community and economic development opportunities that may support the employees, community and Masonite Corp. as the process of closure approaches and layoffs begin. Creating and strengthening positive partnerships with stakeholders will assist in building a healthy economic future for Kewaunee County and more specifically, the City of Algoma.

KCEDC Presents Kewaunee County With "Visit Kewaunee County"

In an effort to increase collaboration and maximize resources, Kewaunee County Economic Development Corporation (KCEDC) transferred ownership of VisitKewauneeCounty.com to Kewaunee County. The KCEDC Board of Directors is thrilled that Kewaunee County will leverage the former county-wide tourism initiative and boost its impact. Jennifer Schneider, Kewaunee County's Tourism Coordinator/PIO, is transforming county-wide tourism efforts and resources including revitalizing Visitkewauneecounty.com.

Visit Kewaunee County began in 2009 as a partnership between KCEDC, Kewaunee County UW-Extension, Algoma Main Street, and the three local

chambers. The partnership produced the website, social media, county-wide maps, Ahnapee Trail maps, rack cards, cooperative advertising and travel packages for visitors. KCEDC thanks all those individuals and organizations who partnered to launch the first collaborative county-wide tourism initiative.
